Concept Note

The time span between 1947 and 1971 can be marked as the period of re-formation, re-structuration and remapping of the nations in the context of South Asia. The Partition of India and the birth of Pakistan in 1947 complete its cycle with the creation of Bangladesh out of East Pakistan. Therefore, the Liberation War of Bangladesh in 1971 problematised the process of political realignment of the geo-cultural region of South Asia. Whereas the former event had the religious nuances based on the 'Two nation Theory,' the war of 1971 foregrounded the formation of the new nation based on linguistic affinity and social-cultural praxes. Precisely, the Bangladesh Liberation War of 1971 established a new socio-political matrix upon which the international relation of the nations of South Asia is being exercised.

The present seminar will try to focus on this historical event of the Bangladesh Liberation war of 1971 and explore the problematics that characterise nature of these South Asian Nations where the porous national borders still tend to get blurred by the social-cultural nuances to construct new cultural spaces and social boundaries.

Proposals for presentation of 15 minutes duration, either in English or Bengali, are invited from teachers, research scholars and students on any of the sub themes mentioned below:

- a. The politics of nation building
- b. Liberation War and its direct impacts
- c. Refugee problems: Issues and Aspects

- e. Indo-Bangladesh relation
- f. The 1971 war and its relation to the political realignment of South Asia
- g. The 1971 War and international relationship.
- h. The issue of genocide in the context of the 1971 war

However, related issues not covered under the sub themes will also be encouraged.
